REGULAR MEETING

Notice of time, date, location and agenda of the meeting, to the extent then known, was duly published in accordance with the requirements of the "Open Public Meeting Act' at least 48 hours in advance of this meeting by posting and by publication in the official newspapers of the district.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Harry Carter, at 8:00 PM.

System back-up is completed by them and you can log into the system from anywhere. The most cost effective price for this program would be the five year plan, which would be good for five users at the same time. The price would be \$2,703.00 per year. This program is not on State Contract. After a short question and answer period, Chairman Carter thanked Mr. Morey for his presentation and returned the meeting to its regular agenda.

Communications

We received several e-mails from the State Division of Pensions, which will be on file. We also received several e-mails from the State GovConnect, which will be on file. We received a service report, from Absolute Fire Protection, for the repair of the starting system on 19-2-90. We received some insurance information from First Responder Joint Insurance Fund. We had several communications with Glatfelter Insurance Group concerning the new company insuring our above ground fuel storage tanks. This new company is Ace American Insurance Company. The old company, Zurich, stopped covering above ground fuel storage tanks. The cost for this insurance is \$742.62 with a \$5,000.00 deductible. We were paying \$935.00 with Zurich. We had several communications with N. J. American Water, concerning the over billing for hydrants. N. J. American has corrected the total number of hydrants.

We received a letter, from VFIS, stating that have corrected the vehicle identification numbers on several of our insured vehicles. We received a check from the Township of Howell, which is our second out of four, for the 2013 Fire Taxes. The check, in the amount of \$315,000.00, was received and deposited on July 2, 2013. We received a service report, from Complete Security Systems, for the annual testing of the Fire Alarm System at the Route 524 Fire Station. A copy of this report was forwarded to the Fire Bureau.

Legal

Due to the absent of the Board's Attorney, there was no legal report.

Chief's Report

Chief Brian Prochnow gave his incident report for the month of July, 2013. The Chief stated that during a call, the R1 cabinet on 19-2-75 opened up and the tool backpack fell out. The crew could not locate the missing tool backpack. The Chief asked to purchase the following items,

1) Six (6) Kochek Haz-mat garden hose adapters for Indian Tanks, from All Hands Fire Equipment for \$25.19 each and a total of \$151.14.

2) One (1) HT1250 Portable Radio from M & W Communications, for a total of \$688.00.

3) One (1) Fire Research Corporation, Dry Gear Pro Turnout Gear Dryer. To be installed in the laundry room at the Route 33 Fire Station. From TASC Fire Apparatus for a total of \$5,206.00. We would be required to complete the electrical work.

4) FireHouse Software upgrade, Five year plan at a cost of \$2,703.00 per year.

5) Two (2) sets of Turnout Gear from Safe-T, on State Contract #80948, for a total of \$5,800.76.

6) Five (5) pairs of Turnout Boots from Safe-T, on State Contract # 80948, for a total of \$1,590.00.

7) Eleven (11) Drag Rescue Device Retrofit from Safe-T, on State Contract # 80948, for a total of \$855.00.

8) Replace the missing tool backpack, from a combination of Grainger and Snap-On. Both of these vendors are on State Contract.

After some discussion, a resolution was offered by Tom Ward and seconded by Harry Carter, to purchase the Chief's requests. A roll call vote was taken.

Committees

Frank gave a report on the Executive Board Meeting, which was held on July 26, 2013.

Frank also gave a report on the trucks as follows,

1) 19-2-90 had problems with the starting system on July 2, 2013. Absolute replaced a bad starter and solenoid and the truck was returned to service.

2) 19-2-85 had several problems and was taken to Allied Diesel Service for repairs. One problem was the brakes and we took it to Allied because they are the closest. Allied should be completed with the repairs by next week.

3) 19-2-90 will be sent to Absolute for service and additional repairs as soon as 19-2-85 comes back from Allied. As of now, 90 should be going the week of August 19.

4) Frank completed a temporary repair to the # one discharge on 19-2-96. This will be repaired for good at a later date.

5) 19-2-66 had problems with is vehicle on the way back from Baltimore and it was taken to Freehold Chevrolet for repairs. Brian picked the vehicle up today, but it still is experiencing the same problems and will be taken back.

6) Fail Safe Hose Testing will be conducting the annual hose testing on August 16, 2013.

7) The cordless drill/driver at the Route 524 Fire Station has stopped working. This tool is about Fifteen years old. A replacement, from Grainger, is about \$300.00 to \$400.00.
