#### **Communications**

We received several e-mails from the State Division of Pensions, which will be on file. We also received several e-mails from the State GovConnect, which will be on file. We received a check, from Glatfelter Claims Management, for securing full reimbursement for the accident with the 2011 Chief's Command Vehicle. The check, in the amount of \$500.00, was received and deposited on April 29, 2019. This was to reimburse us for the \$500.00 deductible. We received a letter, from General Motors, to inform us of a possible issue with the power steering on our 2015 Chevrolet Chief's Command Vehicle. General Motors is adding warranty coverage for the possible power steering issue.

We received an invoice, from New Jersey Emergency Vehicles, for warranty work completed on our 2011 Chief's Command Vehicle. There was no cost associated with this invoice. We received a communication, from Paychex, stating that we have a check over four months old that has not been cashed. George has been in contact with Paychex for over four months to get this issue taken care of. George said that he called again and spoke with Tom, who said that this will be corrected. We received a statement, from New Jersey Motor Vehicle Services, for all abstract retrievals completed in March 2019. We received a questionnaire, from Allied American Underwriters, for our above ground fuel tanks. George completed the form and returned it.

We received a nonrenewal of insurance notice, from ACE American Insurance, for our above ground fuel tanks. This seems to be a standard annual thing even though the renewal is in the process of being completed.

We received several Apparatus Reports, from Absolute Fire Protection Company, for work completed on 19-2-90. We received an email, from the Township of Howell Deputy Township Clerk, reminding all Commissioners to file their Annual Financial Disclosure Statements before the end of April 2019. We received a set of notes from the Communications Meeting, which was held on April 4, 2019. We received a copy of a new Social Media Policy, drafted by the Attorney for Fire District #4, Howell Township. We are to look this over and see if we would like to use it as our Social Media Policy. We received an email, from Underwriters Laboratories, for the finale inspection on 19-2-90. This email included the Annual Certificate of Inspection for Aerial Devices for the 2018 inspection.

# Legal

Joe gave a report on New Jersey passing a law about the use of marijuana. Joe went on to say that we do not want Firefighters to show up when then are under the influence on medical of recreational marijuana. We currently have a zero tolerance policy in place. We need to make sure that all personnel sign off on the policy. We can send someone for a blood test if we feel that they are under the influence of anything.

Joe was given a copy of the Proposed Social Media Policy to look over before our June meeting. Joe said that he would read it over and give us his opinion. The five Howell Township Fire Companies would like to adopt one policy that would work for all.

# **Chief's Report**

Second Assistant Chief Dan Roth gave his monthly incident report for April 2019. The Chief's would like to purchase the following items.

#### Committees

Bob gave a report on the Executive Board meeting, which was held on April 25, 2019.

Frank gave a report on the trucks as follows.

- 1) 19-2-90 was completed at Absolute and picked up on April 16, 2019.
- 2) 19-2-90 was taken back to Absolute on April 19, 2019 for a broken hydraulic line track on the left front jack.
  - 3) 19-2-90 was completed and picked up on April 22, 2019.
  - 4) 19-2-67's vehicle was taken to PL Custom for some warranty work.
- 5) Campbell Supply was back out to look at the cascade system on 19-2-85. #2 bottle is still leaking.
  - 6) Campbell Supply came out and completed two recalls on 19-2-85 on April 24, 2019.
  - 7) Defender was called to repair leaks in the discharge valves on 19-2-96.
- 8) Super Laundry came out to service the two Gear Washing Machines at both Fire Stations. They said that the Route 33 machine is in good shape and could use water filters on the

incoming water supply lines. He is ordering some parts for the machine at the Route 524 machine and will call to schedule.

- 9) 19-2-90 passed the UL Annual test and we received the Certificate.
- 10) Need approval to have UL start the Annual Aerial test for 2019? Which will also include the ground ladders.
  - 11) We had the 16 foot roof ladder off of 19-2-90 repaired and is back in service.
- 12) Absolute came out to check a loss of power in 19-2-90. They suggested taking the truck to Atlantic Detroit Diesel for the engine issue.
- 13) 19-2-78 has an electrical issue. The open door light is staying on and we are continuing to check for the repair.
- 14) The Gear Dryer at the Route 524 Fire Station has stopped working. We will try and replace the motor capacitors to repair it.
