Communications

We received several e-mails from the State Division of Pensions, which will be on file. We also received several e-mails from the State GovConnect, which will be on file. We received a statement, from the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Services, for all abstract retrievals completed in December of 2019. We received two checks, from Howell Fire District One, which are their portion of the Howell Radio Study. The checks, in the amount of \$1,020.00 and \$1,920.00, were received and deposited on January 9, 2020. We received a loss run report, from Liberty Mutual Insurance.

We received a final inspection report, from Underwriters Laboratories, for the follow up inspection on 19-2-90. This report included the Emergency Vehicles Certificate of Inspection for Aerial Devices. This report was for the year 2019. We received a renewal quote, from VFIS, for our Workers Compensation Policy which expires on March 20, 2020. We also received information on another Workers Compensation Company, which could save the Fire District some money.

We received a Local Finance Notice, from the New Jersey Division of Local Government Services, which contains the annual LOSAP CY 2019 CPI Adjustment. The new approved maximum LOSAP award for the year 2019 is \$1,742.00. The Board approved this new maximum award in January and shows in this evenings LOSAP payment to VALIC. Legal Joe gave a report on the upcoming Fire District Election. Joe said that the voting machine will be delivered on Thursday, February 13, 2020 and will be picked up on Tuesday, February 18, 2020. Joe also said that the voter's lists and the keys to the voting machine need to be picked up on Friday, February 14, 2020.

Chief's Report

First Assistant Chief Dan Roth gave his incident report for the month of January 2020. The Chief's know that we are working on a temporary Budget for the first few months, but are asking approval for the following items.

1) SCBA Annual Flow Tests, with Firefighter One, for 43 packs. Total for this service would be \$2,064.00.

2) Two (2) Married sets of Irons (Halligan and Flat Head Axe), from Continental Fire & Safety for a total of \$579.50.

3) RIT Certified Training for two (2) Firefighters, at All Hands Fire Equipment, for a total of \$450.00.

After some discussion, a resolution was offered by Bob Tice and seconded by Doug Howlett, approving the Chief's requests. A roll call vote was taken.

Bob gave a report on the Radio Study and said that Allegiant Wireless should be finishing up sometime in March.

Committees

Frank gave a report on the trucks and equipment as follows.

1) 19-2-90 passed the Annual Aerial Certification.

2) 2-66's vehicle, a 2011 Chevrolet Suburban, was repaired at New Jersey Emergency Vehicles. They repaired some electrical issues and some lights.

3) Polar Service Center said that they can repair the issue with the trailer on 19-2-96. They said that the cost would be somewhere between two and four thousand dollars, depending on what they find when they remove the rear fenders, and would include new landing gear pads and a new suction hose.

4) 19-2-85 came back from New Jersey Emergency Vehicles and is back in service.

5) All man doors at both Fire Stations were reprogrammed during the first week in 2020. Frank said that we need to call in the Best Lock Repair Technician to check all of our locks for needed repairs.

6) 2-68's vehicle, a 2009 Chevrolet Suburban, could use both headlight buckets replaced. The plastic is getting bad and the headlights don't seem to light up the road like they used to. We can get them online for less than \$200.00 for the pair.

7) Barg's Lawn & Garden Shop repaired one of the saws off 19-2-85.

8) Clean air Company serviced the exhaust systems at both Fire Stations.

After some discussion, a resolution was offered by George Patten and seconded by Harry Carter, to have Polar Service Center repair 19-2-96 and to purchase the headlight buckets for the 2009 Chief's Vehicle. A roll call vote was taken.

This year we received a quote from Benchmark Insurance Company for \$40,064.00 for the same coverage as we currently have. The Company that quoted this price is Nottingham Agency. The representative assigned would be Kirk LeBlanc. The renewal notice that we received from Liberty Mutual stated the cost at \$50,363.00. After a long discussion, a resolution was offered by Bob Tice and seconded by Harry Carter, to contract with Benchmark Insurance Company for our new Workers Compensation Policy.
