We received several e-mails from the State Division of Pensions, which will be on file. We also received several e-mails from the State GovConnect, which will be on file. We received a check, from Broadway Minerva Cleaners, which is for the lost gear we sent them for repair. The check, in the amount of \$10,053.89, was received and deposited on December 28, 2019. We received a second check, from the Board of Fire Commissioners District #5 Howell Township, which is their portion of the first payment to Allegiant Wireless for the Radio Study. The check, in the amount of \$1,020.00, was received and deposited on December 19, 2019.

We received a third check, from the Board of Fire Commissioners District #3 Howell Township, which is their portion of the first payment to Allegiant Wireless for the Radio Study. The check, in the amount of \$1,020.00, was received and deposited on December 17, 2019.

We received an Affidavit of Publication, from the Asbury Park Press, for the publication of our Notice of Budget Adoption and Annual Referendum. We received a service Report, from Complete Security Systems, for the Annual Fire Alarm Inspection at the Route 524 Fire Station. We received two Service Reports, from EMR Power System, for the two service checks completed on December 5, 2019.

Legal

Joe went over the February 15, 2020 Fire District Election. Joe asked Frank if he had lined up Poll Workers for the day. Frank said that he has three Poll Workers signed up and will be ready for the Election. Frank said that George Patten has turned in his petition for the three-year term that is up in 2020. Frank said that he would call Joe if any additional petitions are turned in.

Frank asked Joe to set up a temporary Budget for 2020. Joe said that the temporary 2020 Budget would be 14% of the 2019 Operating Budget. This would add up to be \$162,000.00 and would be used from January 1, 2020 thru March 2, 2020. Chief's Report

Chief Greg Player gave his incident report for the month of December 2019 and also the yearend report for 2019. The Chief thanked outgoing Chief Michael Whitehill for his leadership over the past two years. The Chief said that he will try to email his reports to the Board several days before the meetings. This way the Board members can look the report over a head of time. A discussion was had on the ongoing CDL Driver Training with Smith & Solomon. We paid for two Firefighters to get a CDL Driver's License and they have not completed the course as of this date. The Chief said that the problem seems to be more of a scheduling issue.

The Chief would like to purchase the following items, with the understanding that we are working on a Temporary Budget.

- 1) Twenty (20) pair of Hex Armor Model #4012 Extrication Rescue Gloves, assorted sizes, from Continental Fire & Safety, for a total of \$990.00. This price includes \$30.00 for shipping.
- 2) Replacement Turnout Gear, to replace the lost gear, from Skylands Area Fire Equipment & Training, on State Contract 17-Fleet-00810.

A discussion was had on the cost of the Replacement Turnout Gear. After this discussion, a resolution was offered by Bob Tice and seconded by Doug Howlett, approving the purchase requests. It was noted that the cost of the Turnout Gear cannot exceed the price that Minerva gave us for the lost Gear. That price is \$10,053.89. A roll call vote was taken.

Committees

Frank gave a report on the trucks and equipment as follows.

- 1) Absolute came down twice to repair an outrigger hydraulic hose track on 19-2-90.
- 2) Underwriters Laboratories is scheduled to retest 19-2-90 on January 8, 2020.
- 3) Fire One completed Annual Pump Testing on December 3, 2019. All five trucks passed this annual test.
 - 4) Outgoing Chief Whitehill had his vehicle serviced at Jiffylube on December 23, 2019.
- 5) Defender Emergency Vehicles picked up 19-2-78 on December 9, 2019 and finished the repairs and a complete brake job. The truck was back in service on December 13, 2019.
- 6) 19-2-67's 2011 Suburban was repaired at Lester Glenn Chevrolet. The problem was a defective fuel pump.
 - 7) Bill's Welding came over and repaired the right rear fender cabinet on 19-2-96.
- 8) Frank has been in contact with Polar Service Center, located in Cherry Hill, about repairing the rear tank portion of the trailer on 19-2-96. Frank said that Chief Whitehill and he will be taking the truck down to them for an estimate.
 - 9) ESI Equipment completed the relocation of the Rescue Tools on 19-2-85.
- 10) 19-2-85 is currently at New Jersey Emergency Vehicles for the mounting of the remaining equipment.
- 11) Campbell Supply picked up 19-2-85 last month for another Check Engine Light. The repairs were still covered on warranty.
- 12) On January 1, 2020 the 2015 Chevrolet Suburban Chief's Vehicle would not start. Freehold Towing delivered the vehicle to Lester Glenn Chevrolet. Lester Glenn replaced a defective starter and we picked it up on January 4, 2020.

- 13) 19-2-66 took his 2011 Chevrolet Chief's Vehicle to New Jersey Emergency Vehicles for a lighting issue. They said that the repair would cost \$750.00.
 - 14) Frank will be reprogramming all the doors at both Fire Stations sometime this week.
- 15) Defender will be coming by to check 19-2-78 for an ABS Light and also a coolant leak.

After some discussion, a resolution was offered by Doug Howlett and seconded by Harry Carter, to have the lights on the 2011 Chief's Vehicle repaired at New Jersey Emergency Vehicles. A roll call vote was taken.
