Communications

We received several e-mails from the State Division of Pensions, which will be on file. We received a check, from the Township of Howell, which is our first payment for the 2020 Fire Taxes. The check, in the amount of \$223,125.00, was received and deposited on April 18, 2020. We received a bill, from the Monmouth County Clerk's Office, for the mail-out ballots they sent out for our February 2020 Fire District Elections. The bill, in the amount of \$1,648.84, is being paid in this evening's vouchers. We received quite a few emails concerning the COVID-19 outbreak, which will be on file.

Legal

Chief's Report

First Assistant Chief Dan Roth gave his incident report for the month of April 2020. The Chief stated that the N-95 masks we approved at the April meeting will not be coming. The Chief asked to purchase 50 face coverings with the Adelphia Logo on them. He said that these masks are washable and reusable, and the total cost would be \$510.00. After some discussion, a resolution was offered by Bob Tice and seconded by Frank Biddle III, to allow the Chief to purchase as many masks as he could, without the Adelphia Logo, for the same \$510.00. This was determined to be 85 masks. A roll call vote was taken.

Chief Roth said that ServPro will be disinfecting all the trucks tomorrow and will also do the Radio Room at the Route 524 Fire Station. The Chief also said that the Fire Company was approved for a grant from New Jersey American Water. This grant is to purchase SCBA Mask cleaning wipes.

Committees

Frank gave a report on the trucks and equipment as follows.

- 1) Frank said that he has been working with Weilgus and Sons and has finally found the control key needed for the locks at the Route 33 Fire Station. The key was paid for in this evening's vouchers.
- 2) Frank also said that he was able to reprogram the two new locks we purchased back in 2017. They will be replacing a few older locks that need some repair.
- 3) Frank would like to schedule the Pump Tests with Fire One and also the Aerial and Ground Ladder testing with UL.
- 4) We had a tree go down on the northeast corner of the Route 33 property. JCP&L came and cut the tree away from some wires, but we need to cut the remainder of it down. We also need to cut the eight trees from the retention basin at the Route 33 Fire Station. We used Pete's Tree Service the last time we had any tree work completed.

5) Frank called JCP&L to check the power coming into the Route 33 Fire Station. The Emergency Generator was running for almost a full day. JCP&L found a blown fuse in the box on the southwest corner of the Fire Station.

After some discussion, a resolution was offered by Bob Tice and seconded by Doug Howlett, for Fire One to complete the pump tests, UL to perform the Aerial and Ground Ladder testing and Pete's tree Service to take care of the trees at the Route 33 Fire Station. A roll call vote was taken.

Frank said that we need to order a new GPS OPTICOM vehicle kit. We will be installing it in 19-2-93. The kit is available from Signal Control Products for \$3,695.00.
