The meeting was called to order by Vice-Chairman Doug Howlett, at 7:00 PM.

A Roll call was taken showing George Patten, Frank Biddle III, Doug Howlett and Robert Tice (via telephone due to quarantine) present. Also in attendance was Joseph Youssouf, Board Attorney. The Chairman then led all in attendance with the Pledge of Allegiance.

A motion was made by George Patten and seconded by Doug Howlett; to approve the minutes of the last meeting held on September 14, 2020, motion carried.

Communications

We received several e-mails from the State Division of Pensions, which will be on file. We also received several e-mails from the State GovConnect, which will be on file. We received an Air System Inspection Report, from Continental Fire & Safety, for the service of our Breathing Air Compressor on September 24, 2020. We received a check, from the Township of Howell, which is payment #3 of our 2020 Fire Taxes. The check, in the amount of \$262,500.00, was received and deposited on October 5, 2020.

Legal

Joe said that we should make a resolution to excuse Chairman Carter during the time of his absence. After some discussion, a resolution was offered by Frank Biddle III and seconded by George Patten, excusing Mr. Carter until further notice for medical reasons. A roll call vote was taken.

Joe gave a report on the upcoming 2021 Fire District Election and Budget. Joe read over parts of Local Finance Notice 2020-19, which gives guidance to the Fire Districts. Joe also read over Local Finance Notice 2020-21, which gives guidance on Emergency Regulations for Remote Meetings held during a Declared Emergency (COVID-19).

Frank handed Joe two Bid Packets, which were received and read aloud on September 29, 2020, for the New Utility Vehicle to replace both 19-2-98 and 19-2-99. The two bids received were as follows.

- 1) Hertrich Fleet Services, with a price of \$106,978.00, less \$3,700.00 for the two trade in vehicles, for a total price of \$103,278.00.
- 2) Mall Chevrolet, with a price of \$131,500.00, less \$14,000.00 for the two trade in vehicles, for a total price of \$117,500.00.

Joe said that both Bid Packets were in order and the Board can act on this now. After some discussion and the fact that the Board agreed not to exceed spending \$110,000.00 for this vehicle, a resolution was offered by George Patten and seconded by Doug Howlett, to purchase this vehicle from Hertrich Fleet Services for a total cost of \$103,278,00. Joe said that he would prepare a formal resolution for the purchase of this vehicle.

Chief's Report

Chief Greg Player gave his incident report for the month of September 2020. The Chief said that we have two positive COVID-19 cases in the Fire Company and both are self-quarantining at home. The Chief would like to purchase the following items.

- 1) Five (5) Scott SCBA Regulators, from Firefighter One for \$1,425.06 each and a total of \$7,125.30.
- 2) Two (2) Ryobi, Cordless Fogger/Mister, from Home Depot, for around \$100.00 each. These can be purchased through the Fire Company account.
- 3) One hundred (100) KN95 Masks, from 1st Choice Safety Equipment, for \$3.00 each and a total of \$300.00.

After a lengthy discussion, a resolution was offered by George Patten and seconded by Frank Biddle III, approving the Chief's purchase requests. A roll call vote was taken.

The Chief than went over the cost of a New Command Vehicle for the 2021 Fire District Budget. The cost of this vehicle would be between \$75,000.00 and \$90,000.00. A long discussion was held on this subject. George read over the proposed 2021 Fire District Budget as he has prepared it. If approved by the Board at the November 2, 2020 meeting, the 2021 Fire District Budget would include \$180,000.00 for Capital Purchases. These would be listed as separate questions on the Fire District Ballot for the 2021 Election in February as follows.

- 1) \$100,000.00 for the upgrades needed to the Howell Fire Radio Communications System.
 - 2) \$80,000.00 for the replacement of one (1) of the Chief's Command Vehicles.

Commissioner Tice said that he would like more explanation of the proposed 2021 Fire District Budget. He suggested have a Workshop Meeting sometime before the November 2, 2020 meeting, in order to discuss the Proposed Fire District Budget in length. After some discussion, a motion was made by Frank Biddle III and seconded by Bob Tice, to hold a Workshop meeting on October 14, 2020 at 2:00PM. This meeting would be held at the Route 33 Fire Station. Motion passed.

Frank said that he would have NetLink post this meeting on the Board's website.

Committees

Bob gave a report on the Howell Fire Radio System and the possible ways we will be headed to upgrade the system. Bob said that the Radio Committee had a good meeting with the Township on October 2, 2020. He said that Motorola should have a Budget figure for the Township sometime in early 2021. At this time, Bob said that it sounds like the Township will bond the entire project and bill the Five Fire Districts. They are also still looking for a possible tower site around the Route 9 and Route 195 area.

Frank gave a report on the trucks and equipment as follows.

- 1) Continental has been out a couple times to work on the Breathing Air Compressor at the Route 524 Fire Station.
- 2) Absolute came out and replaced the counterbalance valves for the extension cylinders on 19-2-90. Frank will be scheduling a retest with Underwriters Laboratories.
 - 3) 2-66's vehicle was repaired at Lester Glenn Chevrolet in Freehold.
 - 4) The Quick Vent Saw from 19-2-75 was repaired and put back in service.
- 5) The refrigerator in the engine bays at the Route 33 Fire Station has stopped working. The Fire Company might be replacing it.
 - 6) The New Door Locks and cores have been ordered

Frank said that he did not have time to make the changes to the LOSAP section of the benefits the Fire Company receives from the Board. He will have it done for the November meeting.

Frank said that he received a quote for the electrical items needed for the Route 33 Fire Station. The quote, from Cooper Electric, is for \$229.96. A resolution was offered by George Patten and seconded by Doug Howlett, to make this purchase. A roll call vote was taken.
