We received several e-mails from the State Division of Pensions, which will be on file. We also received several e-mails from the State GovConnect, which will be on file. We received a recall notice from Chevrolet, stating that parts are now available for the 2009 Suburban air bag recall. We received a check, from the Township of Howell, which is our third 2021 Fire Tax payment. The check, in the amount of \$275,000.00, was received and deposited on September 27, 2021.

Legal

Joe gave a report on Local Finance Notice 2021-16, which pertains to the 2022 Fire District Budgets and Elections. The State now requires each Fire District to report all Commissioners salaries to the Governing Body of the Township. Joe read a prepared resolution that details the Fire Districts Commissioner Compensation. This resolution details compensation by title. After some discussion, the resolution was offered by George Patten and seconded by Doug Howlett, and a roll call vote was taken.

Joe went over the upcoming Fire District Election and Budget Referendum. He said that it will take place the third Saturday in February 2022.

Chief's Report

First Assistant Chief Dan Roth gave his incident report for the month of September 2021. The Chief said that we are almost completed with the SCBA Bottle hydro testing with Jersey Coast Fire Equipment. The Chief would like to purchase or schedule the following items.

- 1) ESI Equipment for a two (2) day Rescue Class in November.
- 2) Twenty-three name plates for the Route 33 Fire Station Gear Racks from Firefighter One for a total of \$115.00.
 - 3) Two (2) Gated Y's, from TASC Fire Apparatus, for a total not to exceed \$1,000.00.
- 4) FDIC 2022 in Indianapolis for Eight (8) Firefighters, which will be taking place in April 2022.

After a brief discussion, a resolution was offered by George Patten and seconded by Bob Tice, approving the Chiefs requests. A roll call vote was taken.

Second Assistant Chief said that the New Command Vehicle should be completed around the end of October 2021.

Committees

Bob gave a report on the Howell Township Radio Study and the repair to the system. He said that things are progressing very well.

Frank gave a report on the trucks and equipment as follows.

- 1) The New Command Vehicle is at Elite Vehicle Solutions for the upfit and should be completed by the end of October.
- 2) Frank went to Motor Vehicle Services for the plates and registration for the New Suburban.
- 3) The Truck Committee met with Dejana to go over the New Utility Vehicle before they get started on it. They are still waiting on some back ordered items.
 - 4) We will be replacing the batteries on 19-2-90 sometime this week.
 - 5) 19-2-88 was taken to Edwards for new tires.
 - 6) The 2011 Suburban (2-66) will need tires before winter.
 - 7) Campbell was called to check a few issues with 2-75.
- 8) We picked 19-2-85 up from Campbell Supply after the completion of the Warranty paint work.

- 9) The gearbox for the pump on 2-96 is now at Defender. Defender has been in touch with Hale and said that the two (2) shafts and the one (1) gear, that they think should be replaced, could be available by the end of January 2022. The cost for just these parts could end up being around \$12,000.00. The Engineers think that we can repair the two shafts and the gear and get a few more years out of the truck. This truck is forty-one (41) years old.
 - 10) The Quick Vent Saw off 2-90 was repaired at County Line Power Equipment.
 - 11) Diversified Testing completed the Annual on 2-90.
- 12) Accurate Line Striping repaired all the cracks in the driveway at the Route 33 Fire Station. They said that we have two (2) potholes that need to be repaired with new asphalt. The cost for this repair would be around \$2,500.00.

After some discussion, a resolution was offered by George Patten and seconded by Harry Carter, to have Accurate Line Striping repair the potholes at a cost not to exceed \$3,000.00. A roll call vote was taken.

If we have them order the new parts, we will be spending a lot more money and must wait several more months for the truck to be back in service. Either way we go, the truck is still forty-one years old. Frank thinks the way to go for the future of the Fire District, is to replace the tractor on 2-96. We have fewer drivers for this truck because of the manual transmission, and a New Tractor could be built with an automatic transmission. After a lengthy discussion, a resolution was offered by George Patten and seconded by Doug Howlett, to repair the shafts and gear, if we can, and have Defender put the unit back together. A roll call vote was taken.
