#### Communications

We received several e-mails from the State Division of Pensions, which will be on file. We also received several e-mails from the State GovConnect, which will be on file. We received the minutes, from the Howell Township Joint Board of Fire Commissioners meeting, which was held on December 2, 2021. We also received the meeting dates for 2022.

We received a Purchase Order, from the Township of Howell, for payment of the Route 33 Fire Station as a polling location. The Purchase Order was signed and returned on December 23, 2021. We received a resolution, from the Township of Howell, stating the Townships approval of the Fire Commissioners salaries. This resolution was needed by the State in order to approve our 2022 Fire District Budget.

We received notification, from the NJ Division of Pensions, that our Employers Liability for Annual Pension Contribution is coming due. This payment was made in this evenings vouchers. We received a confirmation, from the NJ Division of Pensions, that our fourth quarter IROC has been submitted.

#### Legal

Joe asked for the results of the Special Meeting. This Special Meeting was needed to gain voter approval for a Capital Project included in the proposed 2022 Fire District Budget. The Special Meeting was held on December 21, 2021. The results were read as follows.

Question; Shall the Board of Fire Commissioners of Fire District #2 be authorized to appropriate \$400,000.00 in the 2022 Fire District Budget for the purchase of a New Tractor Truck with Pump utilizing Capital Reserve Funds accumulated in prior Budgets?

Total yes votes-----22 Total no votes-----1

Question passed by a 22 to 1 vote.

The results of the December 21, 2021, Special Meeting were emailed to the New Jersey State DCA, and they said we could proceed with the adoption.

Joe said that we can now proceed with the adoption and the Public Hearing. Joe read the resolution Adopting the 2022 Fire District Budget as follows.

This would add up to be \$170,000.00 and would be used from January 1, 2022, thru March 7, 2022. After some discussion, a resolution was offered by Frank Biddle III and seconded by George Patten, establishing a Temporary 2022 Budget in the amount of \$170,000.00. A roll call vote was taken.

2) Two (2) Laptop repairs at CPR Cell Phone Repair for a total of \$160.00.

3) Annual CPR Training by Team Life on January 19, 2022. Cost will be determined by attendance totals.

4) List of office supplies needed. These will be ordered by George Patten.

## Committees

Bob gave a report on the Howell Fire Radio study and the repair of it. Bob said that the Township has asked Motorola to do an additional study. This study would be to relocate the proposed 150-foot tower at our Route 524 Fire Station, to our Route 33 Fire Station.

Frank gave a report on the trucks and equipment as follows.

1) The new Utility Vehicle might be delivered this month.

2) We need to decide what we are doing with the old 2009 Chief's Suburban.

3) We are having a few issues with the New 2021 Chief's Command Vehicle. It will probably be going back to Chevrolet and also Elite for some adjustments. The engine times out after 10 minutes and that will be an issue while being used at any scene. We will most likely have to send a letter to General Motors to approve with reprogramming.

4) 19-2-90 is at Absolute for service and repairs. It will be a couple more weeks for completion.

5) Defender finished the Pump Gear Box for 19-2-96 and Frank delivered it to Allied Diesel for installation.

6) Allied Diesel finished 19-2-96 and the truck was put back in service only to have another part fail while responding to a fire on December 23, 2021.

7) Allied came out and removed the broken driveshaft and is getting a new one made up by Mr. Driveshaft.

8) 19-2-78 was completed at Campbell Supply and is back in service.

9) The 2015 Chief's Vehicle was taken to Lester Glenn for a few issues and is back in service.

10) Hoffman repaired the Diesel Pump at the Route 524 Fire Station.

11) The 2011 Chief's Vehicle is at New Jersey Emergency Vehicles for a few issues. It is having the Flir Charger installed and should be done this week.

12) The winch cable for 19-2-93 is on back order and should be a couple more weeks.

13) The battery charger and auto eject has been replaced on 19-2-93.

#### **New Business**

George said that several members of the Fire Company were dropped from the rolls after not making percentage. George would like permission to retrieve the LOSAP Funds for those that were not vested or had four vested years. A motion was made by Frank Biddle III and seconded by George Patten, to retrieve these funds. Motion passed.

Bob addressed the Fire Company Officers about current policies and particularly the use of Fire District owned vehicles.

We received a contract quotation, from Electronic Measurement Laboratories, for the servicing of our seven (7) gas meters. The cost of the contract for 2022 would be \$1,386.00. After some discussion, a resolution was offered by Bob Tice and seconded by Frank Biddle III, to enter into this contract with Electronic Measurement Laboratories. A roll call vote was taken.
