### REGULAR MEETING

Notice of time, date, location and agenda of the meeting, to the extent then known, was duly published in accordance with the requirements of the "Open Public Meeting Act' at least 48 hours in advance of this meeting by posting and by publication in the official newspapers of the district.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman, Robert Tice, at 8:07 PM.

#### **Communications**

We received several e-mails from the State Division of Pensions, which will be on file. We also received several e-mails from the State GovConnect, which will be on file. We received the minutes from the last New Jersey State Association of Fire Districts meeting, which was held on December 4, 2021. We received a check, from VFIS Claims Management, for the accident we had with the 2021 Chevrolet Suburban Chief's Vehicle. The check, in the amount of \$4,454.86, was received and deposited on March 3, 2022.

We received four Purchase Orders, from the Township of Howell, for the 2022 Fire Taxes. These Purchase Orders were signed and returned the day after we received them. We received two Service Reports, from EMR Power Systems, for the major services completed on our two Emergency Generators. These services were completed on February 3, 2022. We sent a fax to the Howell Township Deputy Clerk, saying that we have approved the Township to use our Route 33 Fire Station as a Polling Place for the year 2022. This includes both the Primary Election and the General Election.

We received an Air System Inspection Report, from Continental fire & Safety, for the service of our Breathing Air Compressor at the Route 524 Fire Station. This service was completed on March 3, 2022. We received a letter, from the Adelphia Fire Company, stating that they are once again looking into the purchase of a two-sided color variable sign at both Fire Stations. These signs would be so much easier to change then the signs we currently have at both Fire Stations. The letter stated that several messages could be showing at the same time. The Fire Company is looking for the Districts help in these purchases.

### Chief's Report

Chief Dan Roth gave his incident report for the month of February 2022. The Chief would like to purchase the following items.

- 1) One (1) 20 Liter container of Lion Smoke Liquid from Witmer Public Safety Group for a total of \$183.17 including Freight.
- 2) Three (3) Sets of Tactical Worksheet and Mayday Worksheet for our three Command Vehicles from SJ Printing for a total of \$298.00.
- 3) Forty-two (42) Premium Flow Test Service for our Scott SCBA's from Firefighter One for a total of \$1,470.00.
- 4) Twenty-four (24) PIP Model 250-28-0000 Adversary Clear Safety Eye Protection from Continental Fire & Safety for a total of \$174.00.
- 5) One (1) 300 foot of RNR 1 inch tubular Neon Yellow Webbing from Continental Fire & Safety for a total of \$162.84 including shipping & handling.
- 6) Ten (10) Majestic Model GOREGEN2 21" long white nomex blend gore particulate hood from Continental Fire & Safety for a total of \$1,275.00.
- 7) Twenty (20) Pair of Pro-Tech 8 Fusion-Pro short cuff Firefighting Gloves from Continental Fire & Safety for a total of \$1,360.80.
- 8) Ten (10) Motorola Batteries for the APX8000HXE Portable Radios from M & W Communications for a total of \$1,760.00.
- 9) Six (6) Scott AV-3000 SCBA Masks from Firefighter One for a total of \$2,203.20. This item is on NJ State Contract.
- 10) One (1) Stream Light Vulcan LED from Jersey Coast Fire Equipment for a total of \$189.00.
- 11) One (1) Stream Light Stinger Battery from Jersey Coast Fire Equipment for a total of \$39.00.
- 12) Two (2) Amerex Water Extinguishers from Jersey Coast Fire Equipment for a total of \$258.00.

# **Committees**

Bob gave a report on the Howell Fire Radio Study and the repair of it. He said that they are still working on pricing and the number of radio units each Fire District will need.

Frank gave a report on the trucks and equipment as follows.

1) The New 2-98 is still not in service. The truck will be going to East Coast to get programmed and repairs made to things that Dejana could not finish. Need approval to proceed.

- 2) Chief Roth's vehicle was repaired by Branning Auto Body and will be going to east Coast for some repairs next week.
- 3) Campbell Supply did come out to check some issues with 2-78. They found several items in need of repair and we are waiting on a quote. Need approval to proceed.
- 4) Hoffman came out again to repair the Gasoline Pump at the Route 524 Fire Station. They ended up replacing the entire pump with new.
- 5) Nolze Garage Door came out to repair the door for 2-78 at the Route 524 Fire Station. They came back a week later and repaired the door for 2-75 at the Route 33 Fire Station.
- 6) The 2021 Chevrolet Suburban Chiefs Vehicle was involved in an accident on February 19, 2022. We received an estimate from Branning Auto Body and are waiting for the parts to come in.
  - 7) The winch cable was replaced on 2-93.
- 8) 2-93 will be going to Freehold Ford to have the rear fuel tank shield replaced on March 21, 2022.
- 9) We asked First Choice to requote the Air System for the Route 524 Fire Station with the addition of a few more items. This new quote will probably be a little higher.
- 10) Frank did go to Motor Vehicle and got the Title and Registration for the New Utility Vehicle.
- 11) The latest word on the Trailer Mounted Genie Lift is it might ship before the end of March.
