Communications

We received several e-mails from the State Division of Pensions, which will be on file. We also received several e-mails from the State GovConnect, which will be on file. We received a check, from the Township of Howell, for the use of the Route 33 Fire Station as a polling place for the Primary and General Election. The check, in the amount of \$400.00, was received and deposited on March 8, 2023. Please note that we have yet to get paid by the County of Monmouth for the Early Voting, which took place in 2022.

We received a second check, from Glatfelter Insurance Group, for the cancelling of the insurance on the 2009 Chevrolet Suburban. The check, in the amount of \$403.41, was received and deposited on March 8, 2023. We received a statement from the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Services, for all abstract retrievals completed in February. We received a Notice of Non-Renewal of our above ground Fuel Tank Insurance. Our VFIS representative is looking for a new company for us.

Chief's Report

Chief Dan Roth gave his incident report for the month of March 2023. The Chief asked to purchase the following.

- 1) Ten (10) G1 Unication Pager belt clips, from M & W Communications, for a total of \$85.50 plus shipping.
 - 2) FAST Board Training Class for a total of \$5,148.00.
 - 3) Would the Board consider the purchase of a new Hot Water Pressure Washer?

After some discussion, a resolution was offered by Frank Biddle III and seconded by George Patten, to purchase the Unication Pager parts only at this time. A roll call vote was taken.

The Board asked the Chief to look into a less expensive training class for the FAST Board. The Board also asked the Chief to get some prices on the Hot Water Pressure Washer for the next meeting.

Chairman Tice asked the Chief when he will be updating the MARP (Mutual Aid Response Plan). The Chief said that they are still working on it. They have a meeting scheduled for this Friday with Dave Levine, from the Township, to discuss some changes. Chief Roth said that one of the changes that Chairman Tice wants them to make, may not be good with the Chief of the additional response Fire Company. Chief Roth said that he spoke to the Chief of the Southard Fire Company, and he is not in agreement with his Company being added to the plan as Chairman Tice has proposed.

Note: The above conversation has not been discussed by the Board, as a whole, in a public meeting. The changes to the MARP are only coming from Chairman Tice at this time.

Committees

Bob gave a report on the Howell Township Radio Upgrade. We must sign all the agreements tonight because the Township is closing tomorrow morning on the Bond. This includes the Shared Services Agreement.

Frank gave a report on the trucks and equipment as follows.

- 1) 2-98 was repaired at Sea Coast for the door issue.
- 2) Parts were purchased for the Gear Dryer at the Route 524 Fire Station, and the machine is back in service.
- 3) Clean Air was called to repair the exhaust drop for 2-90. They actually repaired the drop today.
- 4) The Electric Nozzle, off 2-90, that we sent out for repair, cannot be fixed. A new one would cost around \$3,000.00. At this time, we are not interested in purchasing a new one.
 - 5) One Quick Vent Saw was repaired at County Line Power Equipment.
- 6) N. J. Emergency Vehicles did an excellent job replacing the decals on the 2011 Chevrolet Suburban.
 - 7) Wireless Communications came out and reprogrammed three vehicles.
- 8) 2-93 blew a heater hose and we did a temporary repair. We will be replacing both heater hoses in the next week or so.
- 9) The Brow Light is almost competed for 2-78. Bill's welding has fabricated a bracket to attach the light to the roof.
 - 10) The cabin air filters were replaced on both 2-66's and 2-68's vehicles.

Old Business

George said that he completed an Audit for AM Trust. This was our old Workers' Compensation Insurance provider. He said that we may or may not receive a post Audit charge.

George also said that he asked Richard Braslow to look into Brice's Auto Supply and why they have not cashed several checks. As of now, four checks have not cleared the bank.

George said that Foley Caterpillar has provided a quote for the Emergency Generator upgrade at the Route 524 Fire Station. This quote, which is just shy of \$200,000.00, is quite a bit higher than the amount we were approved to spend. Bob said that he would ask the contractor that installed his to give us a price.

Kathleen said that Access Health has set aside June 28, 2023, to give our annual Firefighter Physicals. After a long discussion, a resolution was offered by Frank Biddle III and seconded by George Patten, to contract Access Health for our 2023 Firefighter Physicals. A roll call vote was taken.

George Gravatt Jr. asked the Board what the Truck Committee should be working on. He stated that they have not met since the Board said that they did not want to proceed with the purchase of a new Aerial Truck. The Board really did not give directions for the Truck Committee to go.

Bob said that he contacted the State about the question we have concerning the LOSAP. The State did tell Bob that anyone can retire from the program and retrieve their funds, as long as they are vested. Each individual would have to close out their account and start from scratch, just like a new member would.

Bob said that we have a lot of excess equipment lying around and he would like to sell some or all of it on Gov Deals. He asked everyone to look over the collection and we will act on it at the May 2023 meeting.

New Business

George Gravatt Jr. asked again about what the Truck Committee should be working on. An awfully long discussion followed. Members of the Fire Company and also Board Members gave their thoughts as to which way the Fire District should be going. After some time, a resolution was offered by Frank Biddle III and seconded by George Patten, to replace the existing Aerial Platform with a New Aerial Platform Truck. A roll call vote was taken.
