REGULAR MEETING

Notice of time, date, location, and agenda of the meeting, to the extent then known, was duly published in accordance with the requirements of the "Open Public Meeting Act' at least 48 hours in advance of this meeting by posting and by publication in the official newspapers of the district.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman, Robert Tice, at 8:00 PM.

A Roll call was taken showing George Patten, Frank Biddle III, Robert Tice, Kathleen Carter, and Jeffrey DiGraitis present. The Chairman then led all in attendance with the Pledge of Allegiance.

A motion was made by George Patten and seconded by Kathleen Carter; to approve the minutes of the last meeting held on January 2, 2024, motion carried.

The State of New Jersey released the 2023 Consumer Price Index Factor for LOSAP Programs that have been in effect since 1999. The 2023 increase is 6.9%, or a maximum LOSAP Award of \$2,070.00, for each qualified Firefighter. A resolution was offered by George Patten, and seconded by Kathleen Carter, to our LOSAP Award for qualified Firefighters, to \$2,070.00. A roll call vote was taken.

Communications

We also received several e-mails from the State Division of Pensions, which will be on file. We also received several e-mails from the State GovConnect, which will be on file. We received a Certified Letter, from the Township of Howell, stating that the Monmouth County Board of Elections has chosen not to include our Route 33 Fire Station as a polling place for future elections. We received a check for an OPRA request from Peter Goldring. The check, in the amount of \$7.00, was received on January 27, 2024, and deposited on January 29, 2024.

We mailed a check to Wireless Electronics on January 3, 2024. This check was for our share of contract for the upkeep of the Howell Township Fire Radio System. Wireless Electronic returned the check stating that Fire District 5 paid the entire amount. That check will be voided. We received a packet, from the Monmouth County Superintendent of Elections, with everything we will need for the February Fire District Election. Forms were filled out and returned with all the information the County requested.

We received an email, from the New Jersey DCA, that our 2024 Fire District Budget has been approved. We now have a total of four (4) petitions for the Office of Commissioner for the February 17, 2024, Fire District Election and Budget Referendum. The four names are Frank E, Biddle III, Jeffrey DiGraitis, Peter Goldring, and Vincenzo Guida.

We have been in talks with Pellegrino Chevrolet about specs for the voter approved New Chief's Command Vehicle. The Dealer, without our approving, placed the order for the vehicle. They said that if we did not take it, someone else would. We will need to decide in the next month or so what we plan to do. Frank said that we would have info on any co-op that they may belong to at the next meeting.

We received a check, from VALIC, which is returned LOSAP monies for a Firefighter that left the Fire Company before becoming vested. The check, in the amount of \$1,885.74, was received and deposited on February 5, 2024. We received a Service Report, from EMR Power Systems, for a repair call we asked for the Emergency Generator at the Route 524 Fire Station. The Generator had a tough time starting during a recent power outage. We received two (2) Fire Alarm Inspection Service Reports, from Complete Security Systems, for the two annual inspections of both Fire Stations. Copies of these reports were forwarded to the Township Fire Bureau.

Legal

Bob said that the Township of Howell is not interested in completing a lease agreement with Fire District 2 for the New Radio Tower at the Route 33 Fire Station. Talks have been going on for several months with no outcome in sight. The latest amount we asked for was \$5,000.00 annually. That would include the space the New Tower would be installed on, the use of our complete Electrical Room and the use of our Emergency Generator when needed.

Frank asked permission to post a message on the Fire District Facebook Page explaining the 2024 Fire District Budget and the increase over past years Budgets. The Board agreed with the posting.

Chief's Report

Chief Tim McKay gave his incident report for January 2024. The Chief said that they have not had any luck securing rooms for FDIC 2024. Chief McKay said that he found an AIR

BNB just down the street from the convention center for \$5,455.00 for the week. The unit would sleep all six Firefighters. The Chief also asked to purchase the following items.

- 1) Twenty (20) H41 Interceptor Hoods, from Firefighter One, for a total of \$3,245.00. These are on State Contract #17-FLEET-00811-Fire Dex.
- 2) Two (2) sets of Energy Tech Rescue Coat/Pants, from SAFE-T, for a total of \$3,430.04. These are on State Contract #17-FLEET-00833.
- 3) Two (2) sets of Morning Pride LTO48Z3 Coat/Pants, from SAFE-T, for a total of \$10,426.86. These are on State Contract #17-FLEET-00810.
- 4) Two (2) pairs of Haix Eagle Air Leather Structural Firefighter Boots, from SAFE-T, for a total of \$860.86. These are on State Contract #17-FLEET-00809.

After some discussion, a resolution was offered by George Patten, and seconded by Jeffrey DiGraitis, approving the AIR BNB, including the airfare and classes as needed for the six Firefighters, and the personal protection equipment described. A roll call vote was taken.

Committees

Frank gave a report on the trucks and equipment as follows.

- 1) Absolute came back out to repair a few things on 2-90.
- 2) Campbell Supply came out and repaired the Foam System on 2-78. The truck was out of service for several days while parts were being machined.
 - 3) Campbell also worked on the left side 120-volt quartz lights on 2-78.
- 4) The truck committee met with New Jersey Emergency Vehicles about the replacement of the 2-96 Tractor. They seem interested in building this unit.
- 5) The onboard battery charger on 2-75 stopped working. Campbell Supply removed the unit and sent it out for repair. A shop battery charger will be hooked up to the truck while we wait for the truck charger to come back.
 - 6) TELX came out and repaired several phones at the Route 33 Fire Station.
- 7) The fuel meter on the diesel pump at the Route 33 Fire Station stopped working. A new meter was purchased from Grainger and will be installed.
- 8) One sixteen-foot Roof Ladder failed inspection on 2-90. That ladder has been removed from the truck while a decision is made on a replacement.

Bob asked some questions about the Radio Programming that will need to be completed when the New Radio Upgrades are complete. Bob said that the five Fire Districts should program their radio the same, at least the first couple banks.

Bob asked where we were with the Route 33 Entrance Warning Light. George said that the State is still waiting on a diagram of the pre-emption system.

Old Business

George said that we have signed the contract with Foley Power Systems for the replacement Emergency Generator at the Route 524 Fire Station. He said that we are waiting to give them the go ahead until the 2024 Fire District Budget passes. The contract price for this job is \$196,928.00 and is being purchased through Sourcewell.

Frank said that we have ordered the New Aerial Platform Truck from Absolute. The contract price for this vehicle is \$2,310,053.00 and being purchased through HGAC.

New Business

Katie said that Access Health has June 19, 2024, scheduled for our Firefighter Physicals. Frank said that the 2015 Chief's Vehicle needs new tires. Service Tire Truck Centers has given us a quote of \$1,009.68 for the tires, mounting, and balancing. We received a quote, from Clean Air Company, for the annual inspection and service of the vehicle exhaust systems at both Fire Stations. The total quote is for \$1,764.50. We also received a quote, from Firefighter One, for the annual testing of our 43 SCBA's. The quote is for \$1,935.00. We received a quote from Industrial Inspection & Analysis (Fail Safe Testing), for our annual hose testing. The quote is for \$4,787.78, based on the total footage from last year. After some discussion, a resolution was offered by Bob Tice, and seconded by Katie Carter, to contract with Access Health, Service Tire Truck Centers, Clean Air Company, Firefighter One, and IIA. A roll call vote was taken.

Bob also asked about moving all future meetings up to 7:00 PM, with all members in agreement.
