Communications

We received several e-mails from the State Division of Pensions, which will be on file. We also received several e-mails from the State GovConnect, which will be on file. We received a statement, from the State of New Jersey Motor Vehicle Services, for all abstract retrievals completed in September 2018. We received a Safety Recall Notice, from Chevrolet, for our 2015 Chevrolet Suburban Chief's Vehicle. We received the minutes from the last New Jersey State Association of Fire Districts meeting, which was held on September 14, 2018.

Legal

Joe gave an update on the 2019 Fire District Elections. Joe said that new State of New Jersey requirements mandate that anyone, whom has ever asked for an absentee ballot, must be sent one starting in 2019. This will most likely increase the cost of our election. We normally ask the printer to make up about fifty absentee ballots. The Board of Elections will let us know how many we will need this year, estimates are somewhere between seven hundred and one thousand. This will also increase the work that the Poll Workers will have to do.

Joe said that it was time for the introduction of the 2019 Fire District Budget. George handed Joe the proposed 2019 Fire District Budget figures as follows.

Chief's Report

Chief Michael Whitehill gave his incident report for the month of October 2018. A discussion was had on the proposed concrete job around the training building at the Route 33 Fire Station. The Chief would like to purchase to following items.

- 1) Ten (10) Retractable Lanyards for the Flir K2 Thermal Cameras, from Davis.com for a total of \$513.00.
- 2) One (1) BW Gas Alert Micro 5 Meter, from Electronic Measurement Laboratories, for a total of \$1,360.00 plus shipping.
- 3) GPS activated OPTICOM Traffic System for two (2) intersections, from Signal Control Products, for a total of \$17,990.00.

After some discussion, a resolution was offered by Doug Howlett and seconded by Tom Ward, to allow the Chief to purchase these three items. A roll call vote was taken.

The Chief asked the Board what they thought about contracting with a CDL Training Company to get the Drivers a CDL Driver's License. He said that Smith & Solomon charges \$3,000.00 per driver. No action was taken by the Board at this time.

The Chief then asked if the Board would be willing to pay for the installation of security cameras at the Route 524 Fire Station. The cost would be around \$8,900.00. The Board asked if the Officers had included the Route 33 Fire Station in the estimate that they received. The Officers said that they would get further pricing for the December 2018 meeting.

The Board asked the Chief if they had picked up a copy of the Police Report for the missing radio. The Chief said that they would get the report this week. The Board would like to issue a claim with the insurance company, and cannot do so without this report.

Committees

Tom gave a report on the Executive Board meeting, which was held on October 25, 2018.

Frank gave a report on the trucks and equipment as follows.

- 1) Absolute came out and replaced the extend/retract control on the turntable of 19-2-90.
- 2) 19-2-90 was sent up to Absolute for service and repairs. They will be taking care of all the things that Underwriters Laboratories found during the annual test.
- 3) 19-2-85 came back from Campbell Supply, but they could not duplicate the check engine light issue.
- 4) 19-2-85 will still have to go back to Campbell Supply for completion of the warranty list. We are waiting for 19-2-90 to be serviced and repaired.
- 5) Pump testing was completed on November 1, 2018. Fire One will be coming back to test 19-2-90 when it returns from Absolute.
- 6) GM cut off ordering 2019 Cab & Chassis already. Since the funds for this utility vehicle are in Capital, we will continue with the specs in 2019.
- 7) The rest of the parts came in for the Route 524 Fire Station fire hydrant. This hydrant is working at this time, so we will most likely wait till spring to finish the repairs.
 - 8) 19-2-66 had his vehicle serviced at Jiffy Lube.
- 9) Clean Air came out and repaired the Vehicle Exhaust System at the Route 524 Fire Station.
 - 10) Michael replaced the fuel hose on the diesel pump at the Route 524 Fire Station.
 - 11) Frank purchased a new headlight switch for 19-2-93. Should be installed it this week.
- 12) Wireless Communications and Electronics finished engraving the New Portable Radios.
 - 13) We could use some parts for the fuel pumps at the Route 524 Fire Station.

New Business

We received a letter, from Equestra at Colts Neck Crossing, asking when we perform maintenance on fire hydrants. They are under the impression that the Fire District does annual maintenance on each fire hydrant. They are looking to get reimburse for monies that they had spent to hire a fire hydrant maintenance contractor to have this work completed. Frank has been in touch with the Howell Township Fire Bureau and they have scheduled a meeting with Equestra so that they can explain how things work. They will inform them that New Jersey American Water completes annual maintenance on each and every fire hydrant that is not on private land. This meeting is set for some time this week.

George said that we need some supplies for the office as follows.

- 1) New supply of checks from Deluxe.
- 2) New ribbon for the check writing machine.
