### **Communications**

We received several e-mails from the State Division of Pensions, which will be on file. We also received several e-mails from the State GovConnect, which will be on file. We received a request, from the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission, to submit records for an abstract retrieval completed on September 9, 2019. Frank sent all information needed to the State on October 3, 2019. We received a check, from the Township of Howell, which is payment number three of the 2019 Fire Taxes. The check, in the amount of \$275,000.00, was received and deposited on September 28, 2019.

We received a credit invoice, from Stewart & Stevenson Power Products, in the amount of \$775.00. This credit was generated because of a change in labor charges between a service invoice and a statement. Frank has sent an email requesting them to return the \$775.00 overpayment in a check.

We received the minutes from the September 5, 2019 Howell Township Joint Boards of Fire Commissioners meeting. We received the September monthly report from the Howell Township Fire Bureau.

## Legal

Joe read the formal resolution Awarding a Joint Contract for Professional Services to Allegiant Wireless. After some discussion, it was decided to make several changes to the wording before we accept it. Joe also went over all the dates for the upcoming 2020 Fire District Budget and Election.

# Chief's Report

Chief Michael Whitehill gave his incident report for the month of September 2019. The Chief also asked for the following purchases.

- 1) Relocate all the rescue tools on 19-2-85 to the right rear of the vehicle. This job would include custom design, mounting hardware costs and cribbing consolidation by ESI Equipment. The total cost of this job would be \$6,828.44.
- 2) Mounting of all Paratech Struts, extensions, adapters and all related equipment. This would include the fabrication of mounts and brackets. All facets of the truck would be relocated to provide an efficient working environment of all tools and equipment. This job would be completed by New Jersey Emergency Vehicles at a cost of \$16,470.00.

- 3) 19-2-78 is going to Defender Emergency Products for repair and service on October 7, 2019. They will pick it up and bring it back.
- 4) 19-2-90 will be going to Absolute for repairs on October 14, 2019. This will be an extended period of time because they have to remove two hydraulic cylinders and send them out to get rebuilt.
- 5) The New Utility Vehicle specs are almost completed and will be given to the Board for their approval. This vehicle in not on State Contract and will need to go out to bid.
  - 6) Need a resolution for the Annual Pump Tests with Fire One.

# **Old Business**

George said that we finally have added FIOS TV to the telephone and internet account at the Route 33 Fire Station. This will eliminate the monthly Verizon Communications Voucher. Doing this has also shut down the TV service in the Radio Room. After a short discussion, a resolution was offered by Bob Tice and seconded by Doug Howlett, to add the TV service for the Radio Room to the Verizon FIOS account. A roll call vote was taken.

Frank asked the Chiefs if they had an extra Microsoft Office License that they could install in the Board's new desktop. Greg said that he did and would install it in the next month.

George said that he has been looking into what's called 7710 Workers Compensation Insurance. A company said that they would be able to save us some money over what we currently pay with VFIS. After some research, George said that it would not work out for us because it appears that you have to have some Full Time Paid Firefighters, which we do not have at this time. Another issue is said to be that if we did switch and it did not work out, it would be very difficult to get back into what we now have. It was decided that the best Workers Compensation Insurance for Fire District Number Two is still with VFIS. A motion was made by Frank Biddle III and seconded by Bob Tice, to keep our Workers Compensation Insurance with VFIS. Motion passed.

We received a quote and description of work to be performed, to upgrade the HVAC System at the Route 33 Fire Station. Since this Fire Station has been built, it has a hard time maintaining the heat once the temperature goes below around 25 degrees. The quote, which was for around \$55,000.00, said that the AC Units up in the attic would be replaced with heating and air conditioning units. These new units would be tied into the forced air duct that the current air conditioning units are using. The quote also includes running a natural gas line to the attic area for these new units.

After a long discussion, it was decided to add \$70,000.00 to the 2020 Fire District Budget. These funds would come from Capital Reserve funds that the Board currently has. While the Board was discussing this Capital Project, it was also decided to add \$100,000.00 to the 2020 Fire District Budget to fund the possible upgrading of the Communications Infrastructure. These funds would also come from current Capital reserve funds. We are waiting for a report from Allegiant Wireless on what upgrades are needed to the current Communications System. Both of these projects are Capital projects and must be voted on by the Public before the end of 2019 in order to be used in 2020. A resolution was offered by Bob Tice and seconded by Harry Carter, to hold a Special Meeting on October 30, 2019 to gain voter approval for these two projects. A roll call vote was taken.
