Communications

We received several e-mails from the State Division of Pensions, which will be on file. We also received several e-mails from the State GovConnect, which will be on file. We received several emails from the Monmouth County Board of Elections, which are for the upcoming Fire District Elections and Budget Referendum on February 15, 2025. We received a recall, from General Motors, for our 19-2-98. We received a check, from Advance Publications, for overpayment. The check, in the amount of \$41.28, was received and deposited on December 17, 2024.

We received a second check, from GovDeals, for the sale of 19-2-90. The check, in the amount of \$40,000.00, was received and deposited on December 23, 2024. We received a third check, from the Township of Howell, which is our fourth and final 2024 Fire Tax Payment. The check, in the amount of \$451,475.06, was received and deposited on December 4, 2024. We received an email, from the DCA, stating that our Adopted 2025 Budget was submitted. We received an audit, from the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission, asking us to explain several Abstract Retrievals completed in 2024. Frank wrote a response letter, included each Firefighters Permission Form, and emailed all documents back to the State.

Legal

Frank said that we needed to establish a Temporary Budget to get us through from January to our March 3, 2025, meeting. We are allowed 14% of our 2024 Operating Budget, which would put us at \$172,984.00. A resolution was offered by George Patten, and seconded by Robert Tice, establishing a Temporary Budget of \$172,984.00. A roll call vote was taken.

A question came up about our liability when a Member of another Fire Company helps us battle a fire in our Fire District. We have been told in the past that other Firefighters would be covered while assisting us a fire scene.

George said that he emailed Richard M. Braslow, Esq. and asked if he had heard any response from Emergency One on the partially build 2-90 bucket price. As of this evening, he has received no answers.

Bob said that he had not gotten far with someone to survey the Route 524 Fire Station and adding our proposed New Emergency Generator location. Peter said that he may have someone that would work with us. The question came up whether we needed a Civil Engineer or not.

Chief's Report

Chief Tim McKay gave his incident report for the month of December 2024. He also gave a yearend report for 2024. The Chief did not ask to purchase anything this month.

Committees

Bob gave a report on the Howell Radio Upgrade saying that we are still a month or more away from turning part of the New System on.

Bob also gave a report on the Warning Light at the entrance to the Route 33 Fire Station. The State has installed signs that say a Firehouse and a Signal are coming just ahead. The installation of all the hardware should be taking place soon.

Frank gave a report on the trucks and equipment as follows.

- 1) The New Command Vehicle was reprogrammed at SeaCoast.
- 2) We set up an account with Austin Hardware and Supply to purchase some needed brackets for 2-85.
 - 3) 2-93 will be going to County Line Power Equipment for a pump motor running issue.
- 4) One of the Pods in the Lightbars on 2-78 has failed and parts are not available anymore.
 - 5) Both 2-66 and 2-67 had their vehicles serviced at Jiffy Lube.
 - 6) Frank repaired two man door locks. One at each Fire Station.
- 7) Super Laundry Service came out for an issue with the gear washing machine at the Route 33 Fire Station.

8) Kenworth has said that our New Tractor should be going online in the first couple weeks on February 2025.

Old Business

Peter said that he will be ordering some of the Radio Room Equipment very soon. A long discussion followed about what will be happening with the Howell Radio Upgrade and when.

Peter said that the Fire Commissioners ID cards are in the works.

A discussion started about a Safer Grant for Retention of Firefighters. Firehouse Grants, LLC, out of Jenkintown Pa. would apply for our Safer Grant at a cost of about \$12,000.00. This grant would be a four-year grant of about \$100,000.00 per year. After some discussion, a resolution was offered by Frank Biddle III, and seconded by Robert Tice, to hire Firehouse Grants, LLC, to apply for this grant. A roll call vote was taken.
